In nursery, we talk to the children about 'going on an adventure'. This relates to the learning that they will be doing through their play. This term we will be going on the following adventures:

We will be considering different scenarios where the children might feel differently as well as learning new tricky vocabulary such as 'confused' and 'emotion'. You might like to sing number rhymes and songs too!
